Background-July 2006

Angkor Hospital for Children Siem Reap, Cambodia

- Founded in 1999 by Friends Without a Border
- Affiliated with Health Volunteers Overseas (HVO)
- Serves the children of Siem Reap and the surrounding areas
- Outpatient, inpatient, PICU, OR, Pharmacy, Lab
- Outreach

Inpatient Unit

- 26 acute care beds
- 10 convalescent beds
- 3-4 bed PICU
- Common diseases: malaria, dengue, pneumonia, nephritic/nephrotic syndromes, malnutrition, diarrhea/dehydration, HIV

Outpatient Department

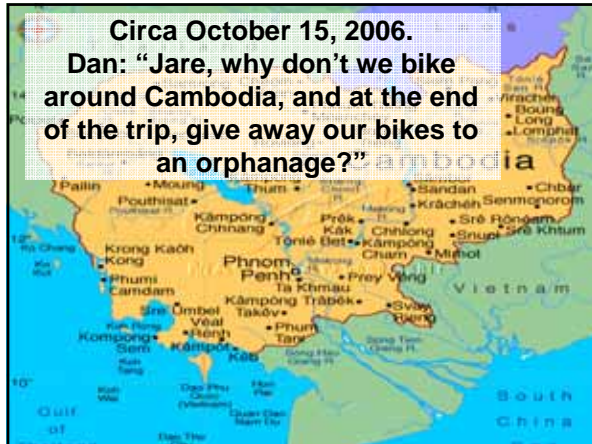
- Sees around 300-400 patients a day
- Most common illnesses: URI, asthma, bronchiolitis, diarrhea
- Also: malaria, dengue, HIV, kwashiorker, marasmus etc.

Outreach

- Around 200 patients enrolled
- Mostly focused on HIV, but also sees pts with physical disabilities and severe malnutrition

Cambodia, in short

- Population: 13.9 million
- Land area: 70,000 sq miles (about the size of Wisconsin)
- Languages: Khmer, English
- Cost: cheap (once you get there)
- Currency: US dollar or Cambodian riel
- Famous for Angkor wat and many other ancient ruins

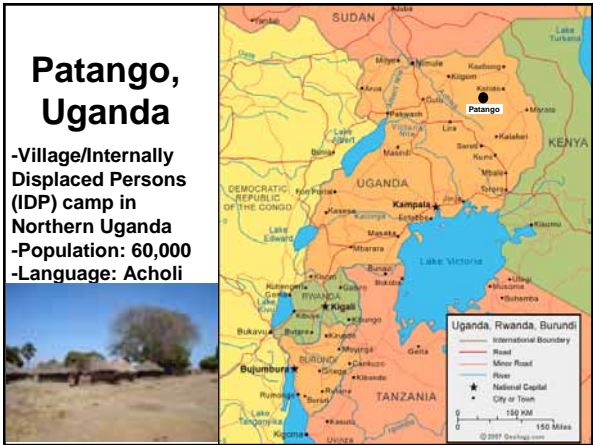
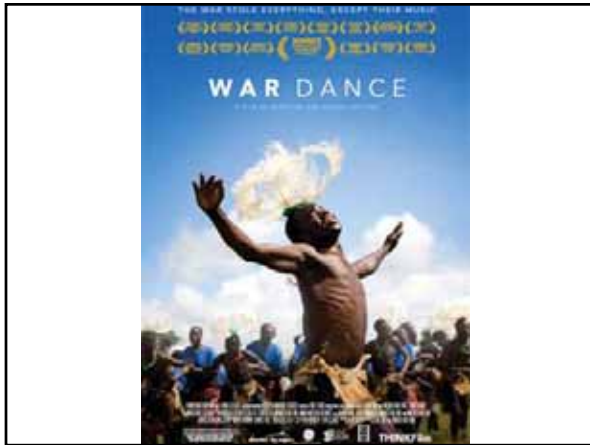

Where in Uganda should we do the project?

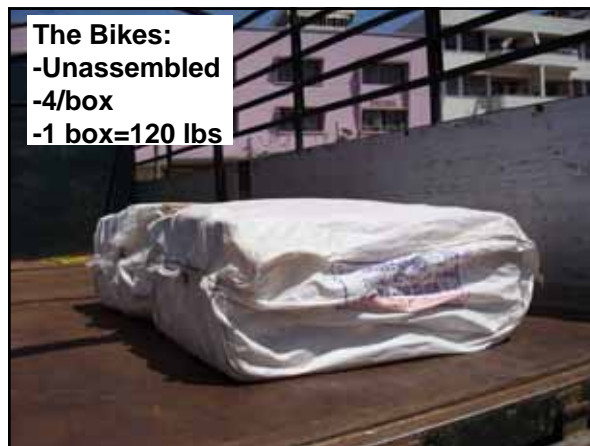
